Dr. Nina Agrawal is a pediatrician, with expertise in Child Abuse Pediatrics. For over 25 years, she has been a steadfast advocate for children living in marginalized communities. She is a thought leader in exposure to gun violence as an adverse childhood experience.

Dr. Agrawal is currently a foster care pediatrician at Children's Aid Society. She is also a 2022 Richard Nathan policy fellow with the Rockefeller Institute of Government. She was formerly an assistant professor of Pediatrics at Columbia Medical Center, where she conducted child abuse medical evaluations in collaboration with special victims' detectives and child protective services.

Dr. Agrawal holds leadership positions in several organizations. On a national level, she chairs the Gun Violence Solutions committee for the American Medical Women's Association and the Child Abuse Prevention Committee of the Helfer Society. She is an appointed member of the Child Sexual Abuse Advisory Council for the World Childhood Foundation. At the NY state (NYS) level, she chairs the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) Gun Safety Committee and was elected to lead the Community Access to Children's Health Grant Program. In New York City level, she chairs the NYS-AAP, Injury and Violence Prevention Committee and the Child Sex Trafficking Action Team.

She is a writer and has authored OpEds in the New York Times, the NY Daily News, and STAT. She has been covered in print and broadcast outlets around the world, including CNN, BBC, and the Washington Post.

Dr. Agrawal holds a medical degree from Rutgers University in NJ. She completed residency in pediatrics at Cornell University and a fellowship in Academic Pediatrics at New York University. She is currently an MS Candidate in the Health Communications for Social Change Program at CUNY - School of Public Health.



David Bickham, PHD

Research Scientist, Adolescent/Young Adult Medicine Research and Digital Wellness Lab, Adolescent Medicine at Boston Children's Hospital

Dr. Bickham's research is focused on the ways that media, and especially social media, functions as an environmental factor that impacts the health and well-being of young people. His work addresses a key limitation in this area of research existing research typically considers social media as a homogeneous behavior, thereby overlooking the varying experiences that young people are having online that likely dictate the direction and intensity of any effects. To address this, the ongoing purpose of Dr. Bickham's work has been to determine how characteristics of media use, including the communication partner, the valence of the interaction, and the extent of attention from the user, drive its influence. He uses Ecological Momentary Assessment (EMA) heavily in his work, asking young people to respond in real time about the details of their media use. Dr. Bickham has extensive experience leading complex and cross-organizational research projects over his career and holds degrees from the University of Texas (PhD, MA, Human Ecology) and Haverford College (BA, Psychology).
